Joel Salatin, a third-generation alternative farmer in Virginia's Shenandoah Valley, is coming to Berkeley on January 21, 2011 to talk about symbiotic farming, local food, and the ethical thread that "connects the field to the plate." Joel's family farm, Polyface Farm, is an innovative model of community-supported agriculture that seeks to develop emotionally, economically, and environmentally sustainable agricultural enterprises. Joel and Polyface have been featured in *The Omnivore's Dilemma*, by UC Berkeley journalism professor Michael Pollan, and the documentaries *Food, Inc.* and *Fresh*.
